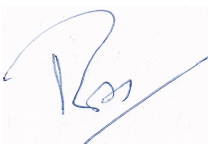
## **Preface to The Book of Ross: Wisdom for a New Age**

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## **Foreword: By Ross Harvey**

In my '7 Day on the Mountain With God' between December 25 and 31, 2003, He told me three very important things:

- That I am Christ returned.
- That I am the greatest critical decision maker in the history of the world.
- That Norah Jones is my eternal soulmate and that her 2002 5 Grammy Award Winning Album - Come Away With Me - tells the story of our lives together - from being Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden to a time in the not too distant future where we will usher in the new eternal era for mankind - as Ross and Norah - the Alpha and the Omega.

Following this time I was admitted to the Montreal General Hospital and was diagnosed with schizo-affective disorder, which is a combination of bipolar disorder and schizophrenia - and was maintained on potent antipsychotic medication. I vehemently disagree with this diagnosis - knowing that my condition is simply an extreme ongoing experience with God.

About a year following my release from the Montreal General Hospital's psychiatric ward - I met someone who would change my life in incredible ways! His name is Noel. He is a very frail man - with cerebral palsy. His speech is difficult to understand - but with great focus you can make out what he is saying. His mind is sharp. I met Noel one day while on my way to Westmount Park - a beautiful green space with a manmade pond and a wonderful tree in the middle which all the children used to play on (they had to remove it as it was rotting).

My first experience with Noel was remarkable!

I saw this shadow of a man - in tattered jeans - a ripped up old jean jacket - billy boots with big holes in them and wearing a hoodie which obstructed view of most of his face - lugging a heavy cart through the streets of Westmount - picking up cans and bottles. I stopped him and when I looked into his face - I saw Beauty! Noel removed the beaten up rubber glove he was wearing and when our hands met - I felt a jolt of electricity as I have never felt in my life! It was as if Noel was giving me a full body hug! I felt warm and cleansed by this encounter! We spoke for what had to be an hour and when we were getting ready to say our goodbyes - I felt inclined to give him some money. I slipped a \$100 bill into his jean jacket pocket. That was the last money Noel would ever take from me!

From that day we began a regular Tuesday meeting where I would meet Noel at the start of his route and assist his progression - pulling his cart or doing other things I deemed would be difficult for him. In these 2-3 hour stints I met a large number of people who were a part of Noel's life. I was amazed to see what he brought out in them - the best displays of kindness and humanity I have ever witnessed - where they assisted him in every possible manner.

Noel had a computer and used to send me little notes via email - always with lots of emojis! I called him Einstein and he gave me the name rJ - ross Jesus. Small r, big J.

One day during my meditation I had a profound vision. Noel is God! As a lay there and reflected on this - I become convinced of the validity of my thoughts. The next Tuesday when I saw Noel - I asked him point blank - are you God? His answer floored me. He said yes! He told me he had made himself physical to aid my progression. And with that he vanished! I have never seen

or heard from him again. Well, not physically. He remains in my heart and mind in every moment.

There is a wonderful and beautiful man in my community who I have known pretty much since the disappearance of Noel. His name is Chris March and he reminds me so much of Noel - as he has the same condition - cerebral palsy. Another commonality shared by these two is that they are tremendously gregarious - they do not let their significant handicaps stop them from living full lives. In recent months, Chris has become a regular presence in my life. It is wonderful! Recently - again in meditation - Noel came to me and told me that in this time he is coming to me as Chris! Chris is God! It makes my heart sing to know that virtually every day I will see this beautiful man - and to be reminded that while he is Chris - he is also Noel - and they are my two favourite people in the world - along with Norah Jones.

What I would like you to take from this is my closeness to my Father - God. I would never do anything to incite anger in Him. In writing The Book of Ross I was very aware of the words from Revelation 22:18-19: 'For I testify unto every man that heareth the words of the prophecy of this book, If any man shall add unto these things, God shall add unto him the plagues that are written in this book: And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the things which are written in this book.' The wisdom contained in these passages are in direct accordance with what is written and as such I know that I am completely within my rights and obligations to provide this to the world. 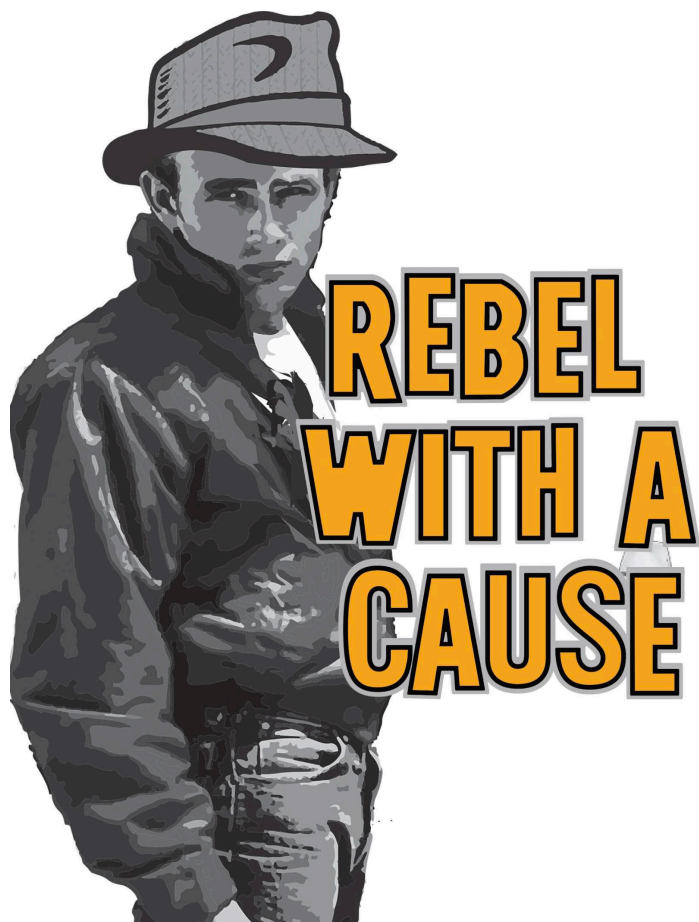
